SM /KS are working on a proposal for bike hire in Stockton. Inquiries made to Bykko, electric bikesharing. They are geared more to commuters. - I agree that the explanation of past train wrecks is vital and I have been writing a journal paper on history of surf reefs and reason for failures / successes so there will be a lot of work there that won't cost you.

SCLG Summary - BW

Informal Meeting with Philippa Hill and Andrew Staniland on 12 May 2021

Ron Boyd, Ian Taggart and I met with Philippa Hill and Andrew Staniland today to obtain a progress report and discuss issues. A full SCLG workshop meeting is proposed for Thursday 1 July at Stockton Surf Club (if available) from 8-11 am but this will be confirmed. A summary of most discussion points is below.

- 1. Three short educational videos will be produced, hopefully by the 30 June, and placed on the CN website. Various suggestions were made to increase usefulness.
- 2. The CN funding application for the rock bags has been knocked back so CN will now have to pay for the complete cost (50/50 the usual division of costs).

3. Harbour Sand Source: The Feasibility Study on the South Arm, which has been approved and funded, and the approval process for sand on Stockton beach should be completed by the end of the year.

In response to Philippa's request on 5 May 2021, Port of Newcastle hosted an important meeting to discuss sand management opportunities in preparation for the dredging permit approval process (due March 2022). Leo Rose (Department of Agriculture, Water and Energy) gave federal support to Stockton beach being the priority for harbour sand This was a positive outcome despite an invitation not being given to community (SCG) representative Ron Boyd. Ron also emphasised that the Technical Advisory Consultative Committee (TACC) needed a community representative.

- 4. Medium Term Management Survey (the four options for the northern section of the beach from Meredith Street) closed on Friday and it was suggested that the results when available from Bluecoast should be published in the next Stockton Works Update. A small number of people visited the CN staff at the library on the two occasions.
- 5. New Terms of Reference have been drawn up for the Newcastle Coastal Planning Working Group which will include five community representatives across Newcastle. It will probably meet four times a year and concentrate on big picture priority actions. The intention is to hold the first meeting by the end of June and opportunities to nominate will be advertised soon.

The Hunter Estuary section of the Newcastle CMP is not likely to be completed until 2023.

6. The next meeting of the SCLG (most likely 1 July at the Stockton Surf Club) will include consideration of the Cost Benefit Analysis of the four management options. Ron reminded everyone of the importance to the CMP of the Hunter Water Land Submission (now supported by the SCLG, the SCG, the Stockton Historical Society and the Stockton Branch of the ALP). Some North Stockton residents have been in consultation with Hunter Water about serious concerns over illegal entry impacting on their lives. Bitou bush will be removed from the entire HW land soon. CN asked to investigate whose responsibility it is to police activity in that area and on the beach.
