The Red Line Rally, over 1500 people lined the Stockton Break water wearing red t shirts, carrying huge banners that stated the 7 steps required to achieve MSN. We also asked the State Government to step up and fix the problem they have caused. We recorded drone footage which we supplied to local TV and newspaper, so we got good media coverage

This was followed up by a mass letter writing campaign. According to Pro Bono advice we received from 2 lobbyists, the best way to attract the attention of Politicians (both present and shadow) is mass letter writing. So we placed posters around town and delivered flyers to every household in Stockton to inform all residents of our campaign.

Thirdly we ran an art competition, I Love Stockton Beach, to promote Stockton Beach in a positive light. It was a great success we had over 60 entries. It revealed the wealth of talent that exists in our community and the love and respect the community has for their beach.

Lastly, we put on a Christmas party and we were told it was pretty good! We had the use Stockton Surf club as a venue, had a member do the catering and were entertained by a local band that had written a song about the plight of our beach for our I Love Stockton Beach competition. What fun! And what a great community again...

And now onto the challenges..

It is very hard to keep the momentum going in the community, the problem of Stockton beach has been going on for a long time...people are tired of hearing about ...and the politics that it involves.

As a consequence, we are always actively recruiting new members to share the load.
