SCG INC. UPDATE Alison Rigby & Melanie Taggart, Co-Presidents

Some positive news from the Stockton Beach Taskforce on sand renourishment. The restructured Taskforce met last month & has committed to replacing sand on Stockton Beach ASAP. While it is encouraging to see the NSW Government moving on the issue of sand replacement, 100,000 cubic metres of sand is not enough. We look forward to a timeline and plan from NSW Public Works in the coming months. Currently the beach looks amazing courtesy of favourable weather conditions & sand scraping by City of Newcastle (CN). Sadly it's only an east coast low away from disaster.

Other areas of continued interest include growth of industry on Kooragang Island. The proposed expansion of the Cargill Seed plant to a 24-hour operation is of concern. The plant will need to ensure the filters are regularly cleaned to prevent odours from the seed crushing plant. As well as increased traffic & congestion on Cormorant Rd.

SCG Inc. has been advocating for the removal of the Holiday Cabins near Little Beach. So it is good news that the removal and sale of the Holiday Cabins stored on Crown land since 2020 is underway. SCG Inc. will monitor the return of profits from the sale to the Rawson Reserve Trust.

SCG Inc. has requested a meeting with Ward 1 Councillors to discuss facilities on Stockton. There are no public toilet facilities between the ferry and Stockton Beach, either east along the foreshore shared path, north through the Mitchell St shopping precinct or at the northern breakwater.
